Clueless and hopeless, she had relied on her brother to take them in, but she knew it couldn't last forever.

But just when she was ready to give up, a fierce determination ignited within her. As she looked at her children, she knew she couldn't let them suffer. They deserved an education, a chance to make a better life for themselves. With every ounce of strength, she had left, Rajeshri made a bold decision to take matters into her own hands.



Rajeshri decided to start a small grocery shop out of her home. She sold biscuits, sweets, chips, and other small items that she could get from a wholesale store. Her sons would walk to the store to fetch the goods, carrying heavy bags on their shoulders. Despite the challenges, Rajeshri persevered. She knew her children's future was at stake, and she refused to let them down. Her grocery store slowly started being profitable but it wasn't much.

For 10 long months, Rajeshri Jadhav struggled to provide for her family. Rajeshri was still clueless about securing a stable future for her children.

One day, a glimmer of hope shone upon them. One of the Zilla parishad officers saw their dire situation and introduced them to Pride India. The organization provided them with monthly food kits that included essentials like atta, dal, salt, and sugar. This lifted a huge burden off of Rajeshri's shoulders and ensured that her family wouldn't go hungry.

With their basic needs taken care of, Aditya and his brother Avdhoot were able to attend school regularly because Pride India paid their school fees and provided them with learning materials.

Pride India also gave Rajeshri a sewing machine and a fall binding machine, allowing her to start her dream tailoring business. Her children were happy and proud of their mother for not giving up despite the challenges they faced. Pride India's assistance had given them a renewed sense of hope and the belief that they could achieve anything they set their minds to. It was a turning point in their lives, a moment of triumph over adversity.

From struggling to make ends meet to owning two successful businesses, her grit, and determination is an inspiration to us all.

Rajeshri is looking forward to the future, eager to expand her businesses and ensure her children get the best education possible. Her story is a lesson in perseverance and never giving up.
